Mrs. Clinton E. Stork, nee Evelyn Kneese of Fredericksburg, Texas, passed away in the Knopp Healthcare and Rehab Center in Fredericksburg, on Monday, Aug. 27, 2018, at the age of 89 years.

Evelyn was born March 15, 1929, the daughter of Arthur Wilhelm Carl Kneese and Louise Almita Sophia Hoffmann Kneese. She was a graduate of Fredericksburg High School.
